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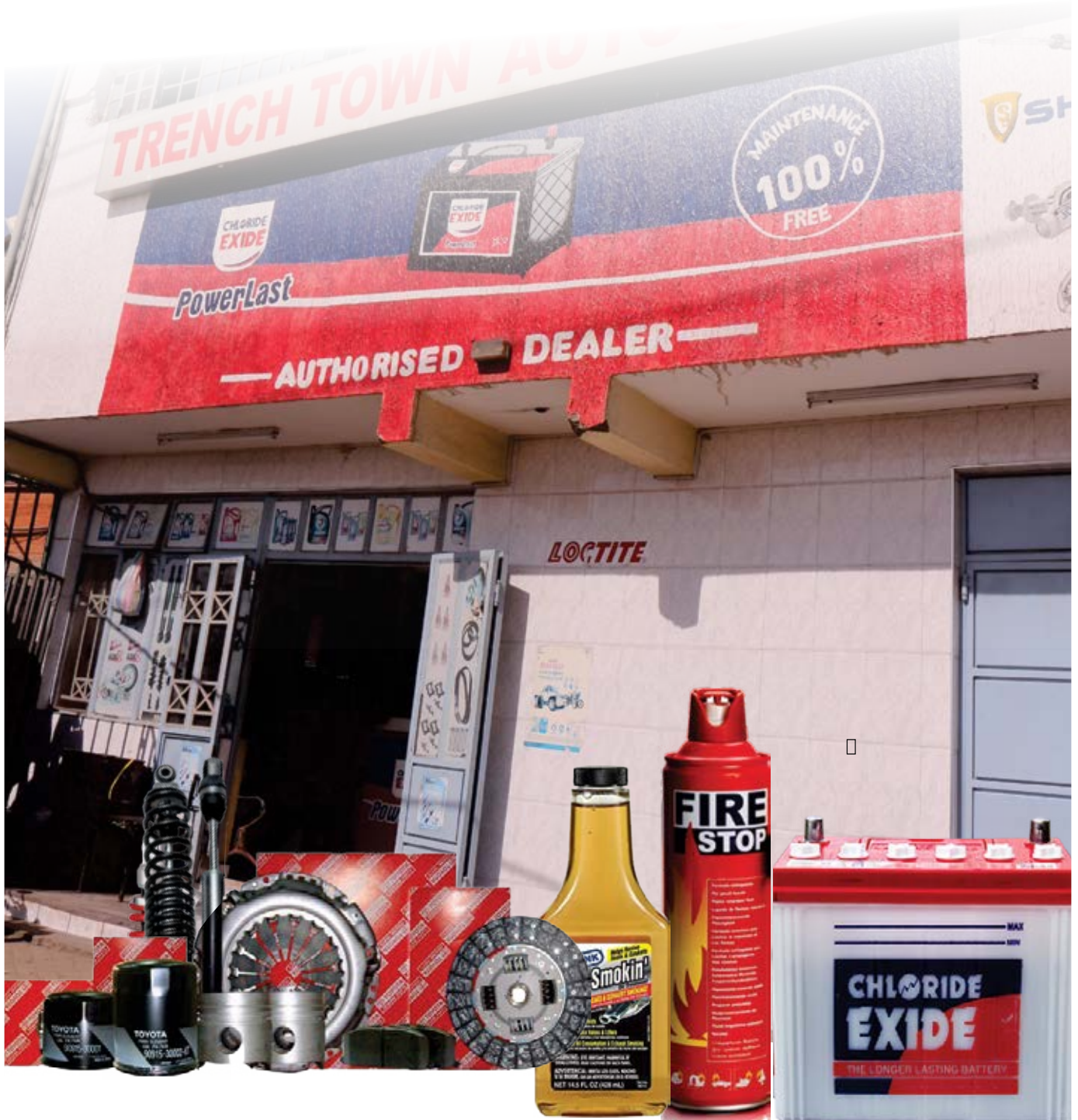
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# From the Editor's Desk

Simon Lepaso is an IT specialist but deals with all computer accessories ranging from software to hard ware. He has a shop run in Nairobi and another one in Kitengela.

Basically, he is a person who believes in progress and always against stagnation. That is why he thought of the idea of coming up with a WhatsApp group as a way of bringing the business community together and that has made him Kajiado Soko Chairman. Here is a **One on One** interview with the entrepreneur.

**What inspired you to come up with the WhatsApp group and why Kajiado Soko.**

The WhatsApp group is a shell and a container for bringing people together. However, I came to realize that the group is limited to just about 230 people and that is why I personally wrote to the WhatsApp administrators in the US to at least increase the limit of the group to about 5,000 people so that we may be able to accommodate more people.

In essence, Kajiado Soko brings up the localized version of brands like Jumia and Kilimal and whenever something is posted to the group, members who are online and in need of the item posted can easily walk to the shop and buy the goods in person. This is tailored to the Local residents of Kitengela Town. That is the idea that informed the formation of the group.

This gives platform to anyone and can post anything about business from property, hospitals, hotels and other things that make Kajiado Soko a better place.

**Where do you see Kajiado Soko in the Next 5 years?**

The sky is the limit for us as members and the idea is to transform the group to a more tangible aspect and maybe in the future work with consultants to make it a Sacco.

**You recently had a breakfast meeting that brought the members of Kajiado Soko together and they were able to meet physically. What did you pick from the 1st Kajiado Soko breakfast meeting?**



People are willing to unite and once someone realizes there is a good intention they reciprocate well. In fact, a second meeting is in place and it has already been paid for by one of our members. I would like also to thank those who took their time to make the meeting a success because we had members who contributed more than they needed to contribute in terms of cash and kind in order to ensure that the meeting was success.

I believe we have the best team and our membership keeps growing, because currently we have about 250 members and I get about 10 requests to join the group on a weekly basis.

One positive thing I gathered is that the members and the business community in Kitengela is willing to encourage healthy competition within themselves regardless of the products being sold. For instant, if the bakers we have were competing to see who would bake the best cake and the best cake was awarded, that will be cool.

Basically, people should be able to think beyond personal interest and allow the other group to flourish.

**What are some of the Challenges you have faced as an administrator of the group?**

The WhatsApp limit is definitely a problem, as I get more requests to join the group on a daily basis but we have reached the limit. Another thing is just setting up the rules for each of the members to follow and adhere to in order to rid the group of verbiage.

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# To improve, focus on your strengths (and ignore your weaknesses)

One of the hardest things to figure out is how to improve. How do you get better and what should you focus on.

The best improvement strategy is to focus not just on your strengths... but on 1 or 2 strengths. Focus, focus, focus on making your strongest traits even stronger. Especially once you are over 30 and you have more of a clear assessment of your skills and abilities.

How do you know what your strongest traits are? A good exercise is to ask the twenty people closest to you (friends, colleagues, spouse, parents, siblings, etc.) a simple question: "what are the 3 things that you think I am excellent at." While you will get a lot of random answers that will be just noise, you may find some super consistent answers (especially if you are focusing more on work colleagues). Gather that data and investigate those strengths.

The strategy that most smart people use is to get good at lots of

things at the same time. They spread their improvement time like one might spread peanut butter on toasted Wonder bread. This strategy does help you improve and you will notice the improvements really fast (because you are often focused on things you are bad at where just a little work will go a long way). And that feedback loop of getting a bit better and seeing the progress is addicting (especially to smart people) so they spread the peanut butter even more and get better in more diverse areas. This is improvement and it is growth and it is positive ... but ... you could grow much greater by focusing on just 1-2 strengths and getting even stronger.

The most successful people in the world (think of Bill Gates and Steve Jobs) have glaring weaknesses ... and it is unclear if they ever seriously worked on those weaknesses. Would they be better if those weaknesses went away? Of course. But then they might not have focused as much effort on their strengths.

If you are a terrible public speaker but great at communicating by writing, then focus on getting even better at writing. Strive to become the clearest writer in the world. Take really hard concepts and clearly state them. Don't succumb to pressure from your coworkers, friends, among others to get a speaking coach and spend hours becoming a better public speaker. Focus instead on what you are already naturally talented at go from good to great.

That said, there ARE certain weaknesses that are so debilitating that you need to focus on them if you have. For instance, someone addicted to heroin should probably spend all their time defeating that addiction (rather than focusing on their strengths). But most people's weaknesses are not nearly as pronounced as being a heroin addict ... and most people should instead focus on their strengths.

Summation: focus on getting better at your strengths and mostly ignore your weaknesses.

Did you know that our learners make for themselves the soap gel, homemade balls, beanbags, conserving environment through tree planting, small gardening, baking cakes and drawing different pictures and cartoons????

New curriculum has also streamlined the assessment mode since only areas taught should be assessed and the pupils work shown and displayed in classrooms or kept in their individual portfolios. The assessment is rather qualitative and not quantitative based on the new design and competencies not teachers choice! Our learners don't compete for grades anymore since the system is

incognizant of their uniqueness and therefore individual abilities are fully recognized. **g. Takataka;** This is a term used to describe a Bishop who has shown no respect to the Apostles wife.

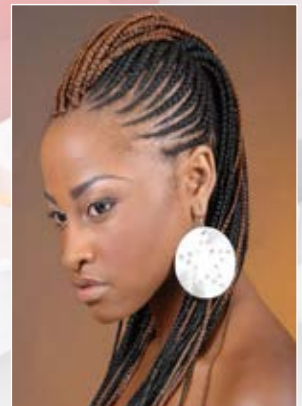

I am Rogers Ambani Musanga from Kwisero, Kakamega County; I am the resident watchman of a gated residential community within Kitengela and employed by a leading security firm in town with peculiar name called Drive Today Security Services. It is Thursday, mid-month and exactly 6 o'clock in the evening when I arrive to the gate of the estate which is my workplace. I change into uniform, dark blue for the trousers and a light blue shirt, later as it gets colder in the night I will put on a *Kabuti*.

Abu Maloba hurriedly hands over duties to me, changes into his civilian clothes and takes off very fast as if his tail is on fire. I understand; he is newly married. I shall handover duties to him early in the morning tomorrow. My co-guard is Jammin Shihemi. Our names betray us. Kalenjins are blessed with the gods of athletics; the Luo's have a reputation for successful political demonstrations, the Kikuyus, the Pokot... Kisiis... Kambas... Masaia...each to their own.

As stated earlier, the soldier's job (Pronounced Soja) has been my calling for the last ten years and I am now fully resigned to be a professional gate man with all the stereotypes attributed to it.

A Soja is a man watcher, all seeing but barely noticed by many of the estate residents. I can therefore with some degree of accuracy give the personality of a big fraction of the residents.

There is the former cabinet minister who today looks a pale shadow of his former television self. He spends most days reading from his balcony. There is the retired military officer - a creature of habit- Every morning at 0545 Hours, goes for his morning jog and every Friday staggers back from a nearby local at exactly midnight worse for the demon drink. There are four lawyers whose -Jurisprudence - if that is the right word- is never to recognise or acknowledge the Sojas presence. ## 3 months old rescued from an inferno.

A 3-months old baby escaped death narrowly after it was rescued from a raging inferno that erupted at Kyang'ombe estate in Kitengela Town recently.

Hundreds of Kitengela residents spent the night in the cold after the fierce fire gutted down several houses destroying property worth thousands of shillings.

It took the intervention of the Kitengela fire Brigade to quell the fire. According to a resident Anne Mbugua, the cause of the fire is unknown but it expanded after a gas cylinder in one of the houses exploded.

"The fire began without notice but when one of the cylinders in the houses exploded it caused a massive explosion that pushed up the flames to consume other houses it was just a narrow escape after the child was rescued by a concerned Neighbour" Mbugua said.

Luckily no one was injured in the inferno.

The toddler was taken to Kitengela Sub County hospital.

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## Anti-Counterfeit Authority National action plan launched in Athi River

This year's world Anti-Counterfeit was commemorated with the Launch of the National Action Plan to set up efforts to reduce illicit trade in Kenya by entrenching a well-coordinated approach by government agencies and partners.

The event held at the Export Processing Zone (EPZ) grounds in Athi River also involved the destruction of counterfeit goods worth over KSh34 million and further launched the online Public Awareness campaign marked 'Kuwa Sure'.

Illicit trade is a leading cause for revenue loss for both the Private Sector and Government. The National Action Plan for Combating Illicit trade is a strategy to ensure government agencies tasked with the combating illicit goods have the required capacity and can leverage their power to combat the Trade.

"It is imperative that these agencies are well coordinated through scaling the administrative and governance loopholes exploited by perpetrators

of illicit trade. The action plan is geared to overcoming these challenges" said Dr. Chris Kiptoo, Chairman of the anti-Illicit Trade forum and also PS in the ministry of Trade

It is estimated that the illicit Trade cost at least KSh 200 million annually in losses and east Africa alone loses \$500 Million in dollars annually in Tax losses.
